St. Casimir School Update...

News from SCS Kindergarten Submitted by Diane Edwards

At St. Casimir's School, we have six enthusiastic, outgoing and imaginative kindergarteners this year. We are off to a great start working with letter names and letter sounds, differentiating between letters and words, working with numbers and being scientists. Most importantly learning how God has created the amazing world we live in and how to be followers of Jesus. Each student has their own beginner's Bible. This is one of their favorite books to read during independent reading time. Learning to read is an important concept in kindergarten. Students have learned the three ways to read a book: 1) Read the pictures 2) Read the words 3) Retell the story. Retelling stories has been a highlight of language arts. What a joy it is to see these young learners retell stories.

Month of the Holy Rosary at STC School

With October being celebrated as the Month of the Holy Rosary, St. Casimir students are learning about the mysteries of the Rosary and are collectively praying a decade each school day. "How is this done?" you ask. With a mystery decade consisting of one Our Father, ten Hail Mary prayers and one Glory Be, the Our Father is prayed during lunch when the student body is treated to a reenactment of that day's mystery—such as the Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth or the Baptism of Jesus. The ten Hail Mary "beads" (paper plates with an image of Mary) are provided to the preschool through sixth grade classes. With their teacher's assistance, the students pray their allotted number of beads each day as a class or by taking turns with individual students leading the prayer. The day's decade is then closed out by the fifth and sixth grade students with the Glory Be prayer at the end of the day.

While the benefit of prayer is first and foremost, the students are also learning about the history of the Rosary as it portrays the major events in the life and resurrection of Jesus, practicing their public speaking skills and learning how to organize a theatrical production. We pray that this month of the Rosary will lead us all closer to Mary our Mother, as she points the way to her son Jesus.
