From Fr. Greg Havel...

This weekend in our reading from the second Book of Kings we hear of the healing of Naaman the Syrian. He was cured of his leprosy as he, "plunged into the Jordan river seven times at the word of Elisha, the man of God." Our Gospel reading from Luke gives us once again the healing of the ten lepers. It was the Samaritan who came back and fell at the feet of Jesus and gave thanks to God.

Naaman and the Samaritan man were both foreigners. They were not Israelites, part of the people of God. The Israelites believed that God was supposed to provide for them. The nine lepers who didn't come back may have been Israelites and thought they somehow had a right to be healed. The foreigners experienced the healing power of God as a gift and their response was to come back and give thanks.

Proud people sometimes feel that many things are due to them. They have, they believe, a right to many things. Gratitude is lost when we feel things are due to us. Humility, defining ourselves as servants, nurtures a spirit of gratitude. We see all things as gifts and the response we give is to say thank you. Fr. Greg
