In the Gospel this Sunday Jesus cures the man with Leprosy. Leprosy was an especially horrible disease for various reasons. Firstly, there was no cure for this very contagious and deadly disease. Secondly, because it was so contagious it was a social disease, meaning it separated you from your family and the rest of society. They were condemned to live on the out skirts of town in caves. Lastly, it was a disease that carried the stigma of being a punishment from God. They were not only sick, and cut for from any support, but they were also felt that God abandoned them.

When Jesus cures the leper he also restores him to social and spiritual health. Sin is like leprosy. It separates us from God and one another. Repentance and the forgiveness we receive from the sacrament of reconciliation restores us to God's loving embrace and heals the division caused by sin. Let us take advantage of this wonderful sacrament and be restored to full spiritual and social health.


Tools for Caregivers?

# This was his last Bulletin Article, Fr. Greg sent me from the Hospital

Dear Parishioners, I wish to pass on to you my blessings for a safe and holy Christmas season. I realize that this message is coming a week late. I spent last week in the hospital in Rochester and did not get outtill Friday afternoon. They are treating a couple of serious liver infections as well as the cancer. I am trying to remain positive. I want to say thank you to all of you for your help in this time and for your prayers. It has been a great gift for me to be your pastor for five years. It is great to know that I have wonderful people praying for me and gifted medical people working on the diseases. Best of all, is the grace of God present in so many ways. As for the future: I have been granted senior priest status by Bishop Barron. In the near future (a couple of weeks) I will be moving to La Crescent, MN. I will be in assisted living apartments so that I can get aid with medicines, meals, etc. I hope to be able to use Mayo hospital in La Crosse, WI to ease the driving to Rochester. I do get tired quickly but I would like to have an opportunity to say thank you and good bye before leaving. I am thinking that from 11:00 on Sunday, January 14, till 12:00 there could be a small open house at OLMC. There could be small sandwiches, cole slaw, potato salad, or whatever. It should be very simple as all the three parishes could help. Catered is good. There should be no gifts. If you feel a need, give something to your parish or St Casimir school, or a charity of your choice. I will be leaving, probably, the week after the 14th. I hope that the new pastor will be named and the parishes are moving ahead by that time. Once again thank you for your support during these years together.
