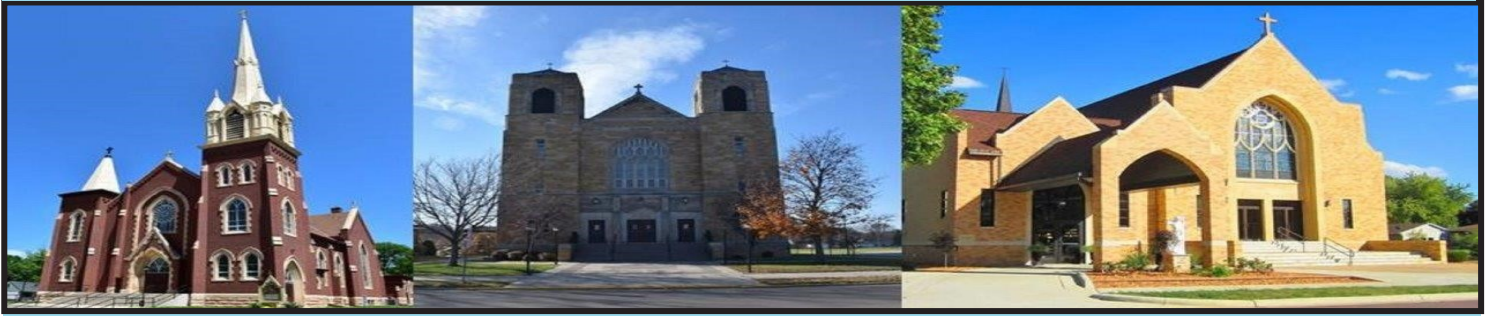

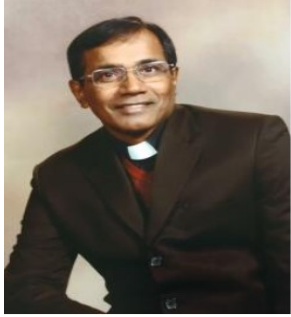

PRAYER & WORSHIP

| Weekly Gospel Meditation



Readings: Acts of the Apostles 10: 25 -26, 34-35, 44-48; 1 John 4: 7-10; John 15: 9-17

“Remain in my love,” and, “I call you friends,” are powerful words that are found in John’s Gospel. Most of us probably have them committed to memory or have at least heard them proclaimed dozens of times. They are words that can easily become trite and quickly glossed over without fully pondering and digesting their profound beauty. When we take the time to immerse ourselves in them, they can radically change our lives and our relationships. They can open new doors of adventure and hold countless possibilities for meaning.

The essence of love and friendship are things that can easily be taken for granted. They have always been there and are a significant part of our lives. Many would say that they could not live without love and friendship, and they put a great deal of care into preserving, deepening, and sustaining them. Love and friendship share a mutual relationship with each other that deserves more reflection.

We can consider relationships that have not succeeded and conclude that they were somehow due to our “failures in love”. In doing so, we assume that human beings are the ones responsible for love, success, and failure. While our weakness, emotional composition and sinfulness can easily impact our ability to love, its origin is not human.

God is love. God is the author and the origin of love. When we love, it is God who loves in and through us. It is because of this divine closeness that Jesus can call us friends! It is not because of anything we have done but simply because of who we are. Realizing and contemplating this awesome reality becomes a game changer across the board. It gives us reason to clear the table of anything that can adversely affect the way we love so that we can open the door for its author to shine forth.

Coming upon this truth is what leads folks like St. Francis of Assisi to leave that which is comfortable and worldly and live a radical life. They relate with the love of God that radiates in and through all living things and appreciate their sacredness. It was having an intimate experience of God’s love and friendship that propelled St. Francis and others to embrace simplicity, act nonviolently, pursue humility, love enemies, care for the earth and open avenues for true justice. ~ Fr. It will place our attention on the role each of us is called to play in sharing the Gospel. Our theme comes from the Gospel of Matthew 5:13. "You are the salt of the earth." Our keynote speaker on Tuesday morning will be Deacon Keith Strohm, Executive Director of M3Ministries. We will pray and hear from Bishop Barron as well as he will be celebrating Holy Mass both days. Decree on Mass Stipends

The most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass recalls the Paschal Mystery and makes it new in every celebration. Celebrating the Eucharist is the highest form of liturgy celebrated by the Church. As such, it is effective for those who take part in the offering as well as for others who are not present at the Mass.

In particular, it is the immemorial custom of the Church to ask that priest apply the celebration of each Mass for a particular intention. Intention may be persons who are living or deceased. Intentions may also be made for a particular cause, a group of people, or for commemoration, (Wedding, anniversary) Specific details of private intentions should be made known to the priest. Pastors are also expected to offer on Mass every Sunday and holy days of obligation for the people of the parish (canon 534) The Christian faithful themselves are encouraged to make known to priest the intention for which they wish the priest to offer the Mass. In doing so, those who are able may contribute at stipend that would be attached to the particular intention. Priests are encouraged to review canons 945-958 to ensure Mass stipends are treated appropriately and fulfilled in a timely manner.

Jesus tell us in Matthew 10:10 that "the laborer deserves his keep." The church has interpreted this statement to refer to, among others, the priest of the Church. It is fitting, therefore that a priest receives a stipend from the Christian faithful who are able to give it, not as a payment for a sacrament, but as part of his wage for the most important work that priest do: Confect the Eucharist so that the people of God may benefit.

A Mass stipend to which an intention is attached is ten (10) dollars.

The decree is effective from July 1, 2024

The 2024-2025 Compensation Policy for Priest will reflect this decree. Any intentions made prior to July 1, 2024 will be honored according to the number of Masses intended with the original offering. All masses celebrated after July 1, 2024 will be afforded the stipend at the new rate, \$10.00 per Mass.
