Hello from the Mary, Mother of God Classroom!

Our eclectic group includes kindergarten, first and second grade students, and together we are thriving in our multi-level classroom and becoming one big family. While teaching a multi-level classroom may be a unique experience in our modern culture, I've already experienced the benefits of what SCS can provide for students in this setting. The older children have stepped up to model good behavior and leadership skills for the younger children, while the younger children quickly picked up school rules and expectations that normally take a few weeks to implement. This structure also allows me to combine children into classes that meet their current educational needs rather than having to hold them at their grade level. One of my favorite experiences occurred while teaching Math to the second graders while a kindergarten student was paying very close attention to the instructions I was writing on the board. Before the second grade class could answer my question, the child correctly blurted out the answer. Imagine everyone's surprise to hear that! These children are listening and learning even if they are not actively being taught a lesson at their level. I'm excited to see the opportunities our students will have this year.

Our daily schedule includes a heavy emphasis on reading and phonics first thing in the morning with the younger children learning sounds, blending letters and starting to read while the older children are refining their reading skills, learning grammar and spelling rules. We read aloud longer books and do individual reading with each child daily on their own level. Math is our second biggest subject and one that all the children get excited about. Our religion class is broken up into several small segments throughout each day allowing us to focus on prayer, memorization, Bible stories, learning hymns and studying the Saints. Our day is rounded out with social studies, art, science, music, phy. ed. and the all-time favorite class of recess! I guess some things really Submitted by Ms. Jinger Woodring never change!
