## Band and Typetasic and S.T.E.M.

 With so much going on during the first few months of this school year, there really hasn't been time to share much with you the exciting new opportunities for our SCS students this year. After being absent from the SCS course line up for a number of years, we are so happy to extend band class to our fifth grade students once again. The class is taught by Ms. Jinger Woodring who was a music major in college, so this opportunity meshes perfectly with her skill set. Although the students are new to their instruments, they are working hard to be ready to play a few selections for our Christmas program.
With Ms. Woodring teaching band during the last class period each Friday, you may wonder what her kindergarten-second grade students are doing at that time. They are joining the third-fourth graders to receive keyboarding instruction from Ms. Aranda. Again, this program had been absent from the SCS line up for several years. Ms. Aranda is using the Typetastic program with the kids, along with additional help from Miss Heather, one of our instructional assistants.
Miss Heather is also coordinating our S.T.E.M. (science, technology, engineering, math) projects for all of our students. The K-2 and 3-5 students meet separately in order to better address their learning levels. Recently, the kindergarten, first and second graders had the fun opportunity to build better bubble blowers (say that three times fast!) by engineering their own blower. Grades K-2: Hello from the Mary, Mother of God Room! Our eclectic group includes kindergarten, first and second grade students, and together we are thriving in our multi-level classroom and becoming one big family. While teaching a multi-level classroom may be a unique experience in our modern culture, l've already experienced the benefits of what SCS can provide for our students in this setting. The older children have stepped up to model good behavior and leadership skills for the younger children, while the younger children quickly picked up school rules and expectations that normally take a few weeks to implement. We've also been able to combine children into classes that meet their current educational needs rather than having to hold them at their grade level. One of my favorite experiences occurred while I was teaching Math to the second graders. I noticed a kindergarten student was paying very close attention to the instructions I was writing on the board. Before the second grade class could answer my question, the child correctly blurted out the answer. Imagine everyone's surprise to hear that! These children are listening and learning even if they are not actively being taught a lesson at their level. I'm excited to see the potential and the opportunities that our students will have this year.

I Our daily schedule includes a heavy emphasis on reading and phonics first thing in the morning with the younger children learning sounds, blending letters and starting to read while the l older children are refining their reading skills, learning grammar and spelling rules. We read aloud longer books and do individual reading with each child daily on their own level. Math is our second biggest subject and one that all the children get excited about. Our religion class is broken up into several small segments throughout each day. This allows us to focus on prayer, memorization, Bible stories, learning hymns and studying the Saints. Our day is rounded out with social studies, art, science, music, phy. ed. and the all-time favorite class of recess! I guess some things really never change!
