All events of the Tri-Parish have been cancelled or postponed. Church and School offices are being staffed from home.





It is a dollar for dollar system. Example: You're going to Wells Marketplace? Budgeting to spend \$50 this trip? Buy a \$50 scrip gift card for the same \$50.
