



From the DOW-R Office of Divine Worship:

There are five Holy Days of Obligation in the coming months. While the obligation is currently lifted in the Diocese of Winona-Rochester, these remain significant celebrations with the rank of Solemnity.

- ~August 15: the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven
- ~November 1: All Saints; this solemnity falls on Sunday, and so takes the place of the 31st Sunday in **Ordinary Time**
- ~December 8: the Immaculate Conception, Patronal Feast for the United States of America
- ~December 25: the Nativity of the Lord
- ~January 1: Mary, Mother of God
